The club donated \$1500.00 to the Kettle Moraine Hatchery this year. The Ozaukee club did the same. They needed to buy new filters to keep those rainbows healthy. I asked them to come to one of our club meetings to show us how they are being used. We will post a date to let you know when they will speak.

3 Million Walleve Stocked in Wisconsin Waters

Nearly 3 million walleye were stocked in none, and to help restore self-sustaining dozens of lakes and rivers waters recently. The fish, up to 2 months old and 2" long, were harvested from the Art Oehmcke Hatchery, the Tommy G. Thompson Hatchery, Lake Mills Hatchery, and, for the first time in 20 years, Wild Rose State Fish Hatchery. New coolwater facilities at that century-old hatchery allowed crews there to return to producing walleye.

It's good news for future walleye fishing opportunities in Wisconsin," says Dave Giehtbrock, fish production manager. "The longer winter led to later egg collection, which caused a logistical complication at some hatcheries, but the cooler water temperatures were good for the walleye, and we were able to pull off successful rearing at our hatcheries."

Walleye are stocked to provide fishing opportunities where otherwise there would be fish hatcheries >

walleye populations in the receiving waters. The majority of the state's walleye fisheries are naturally reproducing but stocking plays an important role.

How long it takes walleye to reach legal size depends on the water where they're stocked and regulations, but count on two to five years before they are likely to turn up in the frying pan. The fish have been raised at the four hatcheries for the last month or two, living in hatchery ponds that DNR fertilizes to help fuel production of algae. Zooplankton in the pond eat the algae, and the young fish eat the zooplankton. Now that the plankton and algae supplies are depleted, it's time to get the fish out. For more info: WI DNR state





Plight of the Yellow Perch

Numbers hit new lows in Lake Michigan

Anglers are famous for their optimism. But when it comes to the yellow perch population in Lake Michigan, the positive outlook is being replaced by realism.

"I keep the salmon rod with me now every day," said Ron Metzger of Milwaukee, a regular on the Milwaukee piers. "I get more action on it."

Once a staple of sport and commercial fisheries in communities from Kenosha to Manitowoc, perch numbers have dwindled to modern-era lows, according to recent estimates.

Perch have suffered from years of extremely poor recruitment, or survival of young fish, since the early 1990s.

The decline of the native fish is thought to be linked to drastic changes in the lake's food web brought on by invasive zebra and quagga mussels in the last two decades.

In addition to poor recruitment, a troubling sex imbalance has recently emerged in the population, prompting research into a hormonal syndrome.

"There is certainly concern for the perch," said Pradeep Hirethota, senior fisheries biologist for the Department of Natural Resources.

According to population estimates, the number of perch in the Wisconsin waters of Lake Michigan has declined from 24.6 million in 1990 to 2.6 million in 2000 to 316,210 in 2009, the last year for which data are available.

In response to the decline, Wisconsin closed the commercial perch fishery on Lake Michigan in 1996. Illinois and Indiana also closed their commercial perch fisheries. Michigan allows some tribal harvest of perch.

The sport regulations vary among states: Wisconsin has a five-fish daily bag limit, while Illinois and Indiana allow anglers to keep 15 per day and Michigan allows 35.

The season is closed from May 1 to June 15 in Wisconsin to protect spawning perch. Illinois shuts down for July and Indiana and Michigan have no closure.

Despite the closed commercial seasons and restrictive sport regulations, perch have not staged a comeback.

The DNR's 2011 graded mesh assessment, considered the best overall gauge of the lake's perch population, found just 283 perch, fewest on record.

The assessment is done each winter in waters east of Milwaukee. Hirethota said the test has always yielded at least 1,000 perch.

Another indication of a population in distress is the age structure. Forty-three percent of fish caught were from the 2005 year class, followed by 2003 (13%) and 2002 (11%). No 2- or 3-year-old perch were caught.

In a healthy population, most fish are less than five years old. In the 2011 graded mesh assessment, more than 70% of the perch were at least six years old.

Also troubling was the sex ratio: 76% of all perch caught were female.

The graded mesh assessment is conducted at a time when fish are well mixed in terms of sex and year class.

"We've seen swings in sex ratio before, but typically we have about 60% males," Hirethota said.

Tissue samples from the fish are being evaluated for abnormalities, including "hormone copy cat syndrome" in which estrogen in lake water causes hormonal problems for male fish.

Results won't be known for some time, Hirethota said.

Abnormalities also were seen this spring during the DNR's annual perch spawning assessment on Green Can Reef off Milwaukee. In 2011, 68% of the perch found were female, a reversal of the findings from 1990 to 2008, when 86% were male.

Of the male perch found this spring, few were actively

expressing milt, Hirethota said.

Though the perch fishery has largely relied on natural reproduction, the DNR stocked modest numbers in the lake in the 1970s and 80s.

The dwindling perch population has renewed calls to stock perch. A citizen resolution that calls for stocking perch in Lake Michigan has been advanced this year to the Great Lakes Committee of the Wisconsin Conservation Congress.

The current plight of the perch has anglers relying on another virtue - adaptability. Fishing for trout and salmon on the big pond has been very good this year off Milwaukee and other ports.

We Need Your Help.

Your GLSF Club has partnered with the **Fishing Has No Boundaries Organization** to help them out with their annual outing on **Saturday, September 10th**. They have several physically challenged individuals who love to fish, and who would like to try their hand at fishing Lake Michigan. We need volunteers with boats to take these people out a ways and try for salmon and trout. The volunteers with their boats need to be at the *Lake Park State Park* docks nearest to Discovery World between **08:00 and 08:45am** Saturday morning. We can use boats of most sizes. Larger boats, able to accommodate a wheel-chair can be used for wheelchair using fisher-persons. 19' to 20' boats can be used for those people with smaller physical challenges. The National Guard will be available to assist in the boarding and de-boarding processes for people in wheelchairs.

If you can volunteer your time and boat, please let me know by responding to this message. The 2 Chairmen of Fishing Has No Boundaries would like a boat count so they can tentatively line-up fisher-people with the volunteer boats and captains. So far I have 2 boats but could use about 8-10 more.

If you cannot volunteer your boat, perhaps you could help out the club by volunteering to assist in the set-up and tear down of the GLSF Club tent. This is the same tent we use for Brew City and it takes 4-8 people to put it up and take it down. These volunteers need to be at Lake Park State Park at 7am on September 10th. I will pick-up the tent from the Sailing Center at 6am and have it at the State Park before 7am. I could use 1 volunteer at 6am at the Sailing Center, if someone wanted to help there, too. We will be taking the tent down around 3-4 pm and taking it back to the Sailing Center. Again, volunteers are needed. (Reminder – Volunteers will be able to enjoy a thank you lunch.)

If you can help with the tent, please respond to this message to let me know that you can help.

For the tent volunteers, you can park for free, but you have to go all the way around to the south side of the island. You can do this by going down Erie St. to the river and turning left, following the river to the red lighthouse and continuing to the State Park parking area. The tent will be placed on the hill above the boat docks closest to Discovery World.






Boats Needed for Chapter Event Date: September 10, 2011





