Report: Asian Carp may have reached Great Lakes

CHICAGO (AP) – At least some Asian carp probably have found their way into the Great Lakes, but there's still time to stop the dreaded invaders from becoming established and unraveling food chains that support a \$7 billion fishing industry and sensitive ecosystems, according to a scientific report released April 4.

Written by experts who pioneered use of genetic data to search for the aggressive fish, carp out there," Christopher Jerde of the University of Notre Dame, the

lead author, told The Associated Press in a telephone interview. "We can be cautiously optimistic ... that we're not at the point where they'll start reproducing, spreading further and doing serious damage."

The paper summarizes findings by Jerde and other scientists from Notre Dame, The Nature Conservancy and Central Michigan Uni-



the paper disagrees with government scientists who say many of the positive Asian carp DNA hits recorded in or near the lakes in recent years could have come from other sources, such as excrement from birds that fed on carp in distant rivers. "The most plausible explanation is still that there are some

versity during two years of searching the Great Lakes basin for Asian carp. The fish have migrated northward in the Mississippi River and many tributaries since escaping from Deep South ponds in the 1970s. Scientists fear they will out-compete prized sport and commercial species.

GREAT LAKES BASIN REPORT -Lake Michigan

Total prey fish biomass in 2012 was the lowest since our bottom trawl survey began in 1973, and follows five years of sustained, record low biomass estimates. These low prey fish biomass

estimates for 2007-2012 were probably due to a suite of factors. We can clearly identify two of these factors as: (1) a

prolonged period of poor bloater recruitment since 1992 and (2) intensified predation on alewives by Chinook salmon during the 2000s. Adult alewife density has been maintained at a relatively low level over the last nine years and the age distribution of the adult alewife population has become especially truncated in recent years. As recent as 2007, alewives as old as age 9

were sampled in this survey whereas the oldest alewife sampled in 2012 was age 4. Whether or not the alewife population in Lake Michigan will undergo a collapse in coming years (*similar to what*

occurred in Lake Huron) will depend on several factors. Primarily, the extent to which predation by salmonines influences the survival of the large 2010 year-class is critical. In addition, alewife sustainability will depend on the success of 2010 year-class in producing another strong year-class in the next few years, which will at least partially depend on

> appropriate environmental factors being met.

Scientists and managers continue to ask critical questions regarding the importance of "bottom-up"

effects on prey fish biomass in Lake Michigan. For example, to what extent do 1) ongoing declines in total phosphorus, 2) the proliferation in dreissenid mussels, and 3) the resultant diminishment of the

spring phytoplankton bloom reduce the capacity of Lake Michigan to produce the biomass of prey fish that was observed only two decades ago? We point out that Lake Michigan has already demon-

strated its capacity to produce a strong year-class of alewives in 2010 despite the changes described above. Nonetheless, having a complete understanding of the answers to these questions will require additional years of surveillance, across-lake comparisons, and food-web analyses.

The GLFC Fish Community Objective for planktivores is not being achieved according to the bottom trawl survey results. The Objective calls for a lakewide biomass of 500-800 kt, and the total prey fish biomass estimated by the bottom trawl survey was only 15 kt. The Objective also calls for a diversity of prey species. The diversity in 2012 was



far less than that measured in recent years, and we note that native prey fishes comprised only 18% of total prey fish biomass. In fact, native bloater, deepwater sculpin, and ninespine stickleback were at record-low levels in 2012 and native slimy sculpin has been trending downward since 2009. In 2013, we plan to add deeper depths (out to 128 m at as many as three ports) to our survey to evaluate the extent to which some of these native species inhabit depths beyond 110 m.

KSFCA monthly tournament rules

□ Sign up will be at Harbor Side or contact Tom Zapp 262-220-0476

□ Start time 5:30 am, boats can fish until 11:00 am (No boats will leave Kenosha Harbor before 5:30am)

 \Box Check in time is 5:15 am to 5:30 am, you must be checked in by 5:30 am (check in with Committee Boat on channel 8). At 5:30 am the contest is locked and closed. No late entries allowed.

□ Entry fees are collected at weigh in station. (If you commit to being in the contest you must pay if you weigh in fish or not).

 $\hfill\square$ Cost is \$35.00 per boat (that includes big fish). The big fish contest is per boat not per person.

□ All boats must have cooler of fish in line for weigh in at the cleaning station by 11:45 am.

Scoring: Each fish is worth 10 points; each pound is worth 1 point. Weigh in biggest 10 fish only out of the total catch. (Boats can catch legal limit of total persons on board).

An additional 10 point bonus will be awarded to a boat with a new member or a member without a boat (only 10 points per boat not per new member or member without a boat, and is available only once per person) A new member is defined as someone who has joined the club in the past 12 months.

Payout will be for the top 3 weight totals and one award for big fish in each contest.

Points from each monthly contest will accumulate for a season long Master Sunday Boat Contest. Prizes for this season long contest will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place.

Note: All boats must comply with WI and/or IL laws / rules set forth by the respective states DNR and Coast Guard. Charter boats are welcome, but will not be eligible for the 10 point new member bonus. Any change in start times as the season progresses will be communicated to the membership prior to sign up.
